

LOADS OF LOVE VINTAGE TRUCK

Simple Techniques - Stunning Effects



## **MATERIALS**

MB-1508 - Vintage Truck Container
Fan Brush
Medium Round Brush
Liner Brush
Water Dish
Sponge

## **COLORS**

CMM 16- Chiffon CMM 98 -Red Heart CMM 31 - Licorice CMM 105 -Storm CMM 62 - Just Blue CMM 64 -Sky Blue



## INSTRUCTIONS

- 1. Mix Licorice paint with 50% water to 50% paint. Working a section at a time, use your fan brush to apply some of the watered-down Licorice to the truck. Then, use a damp sponge to wipe off the excess paint, leaving only the color in the creases. You'll want to rinse the sponge out regularly.
- 2. After the Licorice paint has been wiped off and the piece dries for a minute, use your liner brush to apply two coats of Just Blue to the windows. When the second coat is just losing shine, use the brush to apply Sky Blue to the bottom 1/2 of the window to make them slightly darker. If needed, use more Just Blue where the colors meet to help blend.
- 3. Using a soft medium brush, apply 2–3 coats of Red Heart to the body of the truck.
- 4. Take your liner brush and apply 1-2 heavy coat of Chiffon to the door handles as well as the raised part of the grill.
- 5. Apply 3 coats of Chiffon to the bumpers and the hubcaps using your medium brush.
- 6. Using s fan brush, apply 2-3 coats of Storm to the inside of the bed of the truck.
- 7. Finally, apply 2–3 coats of Licorice to the tires.

## **TIPS**

- Make sure to water down your paint when antiquing, we recommend 50% water to 50% paint
- When wiping off the paint as your antique the truck, rinse out the sponge frequently.
- Don't worry if the Licorice stains the pottery, that's what we are going for!
- When the paints are still damp, the colors blend together, use that to your advantage on the windows.
- When using your liner brush, lighter pressure will create thinner lines.
